

Tui 12 KIT LIST FOR GUIDES

Jamboree at Tui Ridge, Rotorua 2012

- All gear must be labelled with name, ID number and group colour, and packed in a bag or box that can be kept waterproof during camp.
- Guide uniform should be worn travelling to and from jamboree.
- Girls should be involved in packing their gear for camp. They can tick the IN box as they pack gear for camp and the OUT box as they pack ready to leave camp.

	Sleeping Gear This should be lined with a plastic bad and packed in a waterproof zip bag or bedroll:	
	ground sheet (at least 1m by 2m)	
	snow foam, thermarest or self-inflating mattress (no airbeds/lilos, foam mattresses or camp stretchers)	
	sleeping bag, liner (optional)	
	blanket or rug	
	small pillow (must fit in your bedding bag/roll)	
	soft toy for bedmate (optional)	
	warm pyjamas	

IN	Clothing	OUT
	Guide uniform (no sash required)	
	3/4 length waterproof jacket with hood	
	wool jersey, polar fleece or bush shirt	
	Sweatshirt	
	t shirts (no singlets) Guide or group colours if possible	
	thermal underwear (i.e. polyprops)	
	trackpants, jeans, 3/4 pants (navy if possible)	
	shorts (navy if possible)	
	8 sets of underwear	
	2 pairs of shoes, either sneakers or strap on sandals (no jandals, crocs)	
	1 pair of shoes to get wet & muddy	
	Gumboots (optional)	
	4 pairs of socks	
	woollen hat/ beanie	
	swim togs & towel in a plastic bag	
	set of old clothes for mud fun	

IN	Toiletries	OUT
	toothbrush & toothpaste	
	face cloth, soap or bodywash	
	shampoo in small container	
	hairbrush or comb, hair ties	
	Towel	
	sanitary requirements	
	Roll on/stick deodorant (not spray)	
	Sun screen	
	Roll on/stick Insect repellent (not spray)	
	personal medication	
	personal first aid kit - sticking plasters, hand sanitizer, tissues, 1 x disposable plastic gloves, sterile dressing, safety pins, small plastic bag for rubbish	

IN	Eating gear	OUT
	Please bring in a ditty bag, all named:	
	unbreakable large & small plate, bowl & cup	
	unbreakable knife, fork, spoon, teaspoon	
	drink bottle	
	2 tea towels	
	lunch box/ small cooler bag	

IN	Extras	OUT
	day pack (like a school backpack)	
	torch and spare batteries	
	sit-upon (small plastic sheet)	
	plastic bags for dirty clothing	
	pens and a notebook	
	camera (optional)	
	6 clothes pegs and laundry soap in small plastic bag	
	large ziplock bag to use for washing	

Other things you may like to know about your gear

Packing to go

Please bring with you morning tea and lunch for Saturday in your day pack separate from your main luggage.

Make sure that you can manage your own gear, identify it and carry it short distances.

If flying make sure that all cutlery is packed in your luggage and not your day pack as it will be confiscated at the security check at the airport.

Pack items in clear plastic bags as it makes gear easy to find in your box or bag and helps keep your tent tidy.

Guide uniform should be worn travelling to and from jamboree and also at camp if possible. T-shirt or polo shirts in your group colour or from previous guide events are great for wearing on site.

If you don't have a $\frac{3}{4}$ length waterproof jacket with hood, you may bring an alternative waterproof outer layer e.g. long coat or jacket/trousers.

You do not need to bring jewellery, badge sashes or lanyards.

Do not bring cell phones as there is poor reception and no charging facilities.

Labelling

You will receive notification of your group colour. Be creative with how you identify your gear with your colour. You could use ribbon, material strips, laminated cards...

Toilet gear

Non spray deodorant and insect repellent is preferred as the gases in aerosol cans can damage tent walls.

Finances

There will be a shop on site for souvenirs, drinks and ice-blocks. On your off-site days you will also be able to buy souvenirs. Eftpos will be available. Cash for drinks and ice-blocks will make buying these, if you wish too, much quicker.
